

# Sermon Study Questions

1. Paul tells us in 1 Thess.4 that we grieve not as those who have no hope. What does he mean by that?
2. Read Acts 13:13-43
3. In reading Paul's sermon to those in the synagogue in Antioch he begins by talking about God's gracious provision for Israel. How is this seen? What is his purpose in doing this?
4. Paul goes on to show that Jesus is the offspring that God promised to David, the one who would sit on his throne forever. What is the significance of that in the context of this sermon?
5. Paul begins to speak about the resurrection in v.30 by first pointing to the eye-witnesses to it. Why is this such an important thing for Paul to point to in substantiating the resurrection?
6. Paul also points to the testimony of Scripture to validate the resurrection. What makes this such an effective apologetic?
7. In v.38 Paul ties the resurrection together with God's gracious promise of forgiveness and justification. In what way are they connected with each other?
8. Why is the resurrection so important to the gospel?
9. How does the truth of the resurrection impact you and the way you approach life?
