4. What does the imagery of a river speak to us about and how does this relate to John's vision of the New Jerusalem in Revelation?
5. How do the names of God used in Psalm 46 help us to have confidence in Him at times we might be tempted to be afraid?
6. How does God's protecting His people in the past help us to have confidence in Him at times we might be tempted to be afraid?
7. Since the conclusion to the psalmist's argument is that we should be still and trust in God, what does this tell us about God's relationship to the trials in our lives?
8. How does God's sovereignty and presence with us help us when the worst happens?
9. How does Psalm 46 help us even in the ordinary trials of life?
10. What does the quote from R.C. Sproul say is the solution to fear and worry?
