

Sermon Study Questions

1. Read Matthew 20:29-34
2. What stands out to you about this crowd, and what lesson do you learn from the crowd in this account?
3. As we saw, Jesus stops and asks these two blind men what they would like for Him to do for them. What would you answer if Jesus were to ask you the same question?
4. Why is this question such a good question to ask ourselves?
5. Jesus responds in pity to these blind men and touches and heals them. In doing so, there are three observations we made. The first is that He stopped. What is significant about that, and what encouragement do you derive from that?
6. Though Jesus stopped and responded to these poor blind men in their suffering, He didn't do so right away. Why does the Lord at times make us repeatedly ask and then wait before answering? What lessons do you learn from that?
7. God doesn't always act the same way towards people in their suffering. Sometimes He responds in a way like He did to these two blind men by bringing healing. Other times He does not. Understanding the doctrine of the simplicity of God gives us insight into why that might be. With that in mind, what is the simplicity of God? What is a practical implication of this doctrine?
8. How does the cross highlight the simplicity of God?
9. What practical application can you make from this text/sermon?
